SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General Information:

If unconscious place in recovery position and seek medical advice. Provide fresh air. If breathing is irregular or stopped, administer artificial respiration. No mouth-to-mouth or mouth-to-nose resuscitation. Use Ambu bag or ventilator.

Inhalation:

Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. Get medical attention or advice if you feel unwell.

Skin contact:

Wash skin with plenty of lukewarm, gently flowing water for at least 30 minutes. Wash skin with plenty of lukewarm, gently flowing water. Rinse mouth. Immediately drink 1 glass of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Do NOT induce vomiting. Keep at rest. Immediately call a POISON CENTRE, doctor or physician.

4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Inhalation:
